



1. Integrate Design

Civic design is more impactful when it is integrated with other key innovation skills.

Integrate design to: *Produce cost savings*



Anchorage, Alaska Developed mailings to, save \$1.6M for exempt Anchorage seniors.





Syracuse, New York



Generated \$1.47 million in cost savings and revenue collection








2. Measure Impact

Using a civic design approach to generate new ideas by itself is not enough, designers must go further and measure the impact those ideas have.

Measure impact to: *Build equitable city services*





Durham, North Carolina


Helped more than 7,600 residents get closer to restoring their drivers license and saved them \$2M in debt relief



Mobile, Alabama



The City <u>reduced the number of blighted</u> <u>properties by 53%.</u>



3. Tell Your Story

Telling your story is one of the most important things civic designers can do to build long-term support for their work, and it is the one activity that is often the most overlooked.

Tell your story to: Improve crisis response





Helped design the front-encoustomer interface of the City's testing program.



Paris, France



<u>Transformed the city's public</u> <u>schoolyards</u> into public shelters during heat wayes...



4. *Teach* Others

By making the time to teach others how to apply design in a civic space, teams will build long-term capacity and support for sustaining this way of working in government.

Teach others to: *Scale civic design*





Sioux Falls. South Dakota


After an initial training, they taught 72 additional staff in design, <u>launched 7 additional projects and established an Office of Innovation and Technology.</u>



Bratislava, Slovakia



After completing a pilot training, the city <u>created an Office of Innovation</u> and hired 6 new staff members to spread this throughout city hall.



5. Plan Ahead

Don't wait until the last minute to build institutional support for this way of working.

Planning ahead to: *Expand their role*





Baltimore, MD

Overcame three mayoral turnovers and have expanded into the new Office of Performance and Innovation



Minneapolis, MN



After several compelling and impactful projects and surviving mayoral turnover, they have been given an expanded role leading the new Office of Performance and Innovation.
